1. What is Care.Card UX Contest about?

Care.Card UX Contest is about improving the situation in the healthcare industry for all those involved worldwide.

2. Is this contest a one-time thing?

Care.Card UX Contest is the first in the series of contests organized by Solve.Care. We will continue to create these contests as long as there is need for improvement in the healthcare industry.

3. Who can participate in the Contest?

Anyone who enters can participate in the contest.

4. How much does it cost to participate?

Nothing. It is free to participate.

5. What skills are required to build Care.Cards?

To build a Care.Card your team will need the skills of a perfect duo: UX designer and React Native developer. If you lack a React Native developer or UX designer, you can leave your contacts in the collaboration list for other participants to reach you. The list is available after registration.

6. How do I participate?

Fill the registration form at solve.care/contest and submit your project as soon as July 5th and no later than July 19th.

7. What is Care.Card?

Care.Cards are intelligent apps that automate the healthcare processes inside Care.Wallet blockchain ecosystem. Among other things they are built to administrate and facilitate healthcare delivery. For more details, please read Solve.Care official [whitepaper](#).

- Schedule a visit
- Manage prescriptions
- How are you feeling today

9. How many Care.Cards should I design?

You are welcome to build one or all three Care.Cards.

10. What languages, skills and technologies do I need to participate?

You need React Native and Expo knowledge to realize an awesome UX design of your Care.Card.

11. What is the timeline of the contest?

Registration period: June 22 – July 17

Submission period: July 5 – July 19

Judging period: July 20 – August 1

Winners announcement: August 3

12. Who will evaluate my submission?

A panel of domain experts and industry executives will choose the winners for best of each of three Care.Cards:

13. How do judges review and evaluate the submissions?

The judges review and evaluate the submissions on the various aspects including, but not limited to:

- Visual design (Visual flow, catchy design, compositional accordance and visual aesthetics etc.)
- Usability (Intuitive for people of all ages, works for consumers with disabilities, makes it easy to perform next best action, works in multiple languages, delightful user experience, switches between left handed/right handed)
- Creativity (How creative has the group been in solving the challenge?)
- Content (Societal value, proper words and expressions etc.)

14. Which submissions pass the qualification stage and receive at least 1000 CAN tokens?

Those submissions that are fully completed according to Contest's requirements and official rules. Any content deemed as offensive, pornographic, damaging or inappropriate for publishing will not be accepted.

15. How many winners are there in the contest?

There are three winners per every Care.Card, with the first, second and third places. So, in total, there will be nine winners.

16. How many tokens will I get for my participation?

All the submissions that pass qualification stage will receive 1000 CAN tokens. All the winners will get their prizes the following way:

1st place – 100 000 CAN

2nd place – 35 000 CAN

3rd place – 15 000 CAN

17. What is Best Video Bonus Prize? Is it obligatory to participate?

Majority vote from the Solve.Care community on the best video presentation (via our YouTube channel) will receive the Best Video Bonus Prize of 10,000 CAN tokens. This is a people's choice award and will not be decided by the Jury. The participation is completely voluntary.

18. If I win, how can I receive my tokens?

To receive the tokens you must have a Solve.Care wallet and this wallet must pass Know Your Customer (KYC) procedure.

19. What is the price per token?

During Solve.Care CAN token sale, which ended on April 30, 2018, the price of 1 CAN token ranged from \$0.07 to \$0.1.
